












Local engagement at University of Worcester in 2024-25

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
Since Green Impact launched at the University of Worcester, in 2011, we've seen 181 team awards presented for over 2,300 positive sustainability actions and 86 projects, led by more than 365 people directly involved in Green Impact teams. Here's what has been achieved in 2024-25...



20 teams registered projects, with 8 teams submitting their project this year and receiving an award



22 people led Green Impact teams



Provided 17 students with training and development opportunities in their roles as project assistants



Reached more than 19,800 students, and community members via Green Impact projects




Provided 7 students with IEMA-approved training and development opportunities in their roles as Green Impact auditors

Fairtrade at University of Worcester

Responses to the University of Worcester Fairtrade Survey of 2023



Fairtrade

This year the Fairtrade project team have been working hard on their submission for Fairtrade certification. To support education on fairtrade they ran an online presentation during Go Green Week, conducted a survey and engaged with the fairtrade fortnight!

Lakeside Campus Nature Trail

This project team has created a nature walk around the Lakeside Campus, promoting environmental wellbeing and mindfulness. This trail has reached an estimated 14,500 people!



SU Monthly Wildlife Photo Competition

Students submitted their best photos of the natural world to win a prize. This project invited students to look closer at nature and develop a stronger connection with it!

You Matter

This project team focused on SDG 3, good health and wellbeing by putting on an event focused on student mental health. Students were invited to have a hot drink and chat whilst they did arts and crafts on paper trees where they could reflect on their goals and wellbeing. Students kept these trees as points of reflection to use throughout the year!

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Overview of Green Impact projects at University of Worcester 2024-2025



Sustainability Podcast

An impactful and returning project, the sustainability podcast team have created a new series of episodes covering construction, the oceans, plastic waste and more. They have a focus on collaboration, showing their commitment to goal 17, 'Partnership for the Goals'.



Lavender Bags

This project harvested the lavender on campus to use for its plethora of health benefits - better sleep, pain relief, digestive aid and more! These bags will find themselves on the pillows of 950 residents come September to welcome them to their new homes!

Vape Recycling

A highly relevant project that has worked to provide vape recycling facilities on campus to ensure the responsible disposal of these products. This could support an increase in the reuse of lithium, which are used in electric car batteries!




Water Saving Project

This project analysed how the water usage at the University of Worcester could be reduced. This was done by estimating the amount of water used by flushing and identifying outlets that could be removed. The team also looked at how much water could be saved by the installation of flow restrictors across the university. The reports make practical and convincing suggestions for water savings!

Supporting the Sustainability Strategy 2020- 2030

Green Impact is a standing agenda on the Sustainability Strategy Group and supports the wider University of Worcester Sustainability Strategy 2020-2030. The variety of projects and areas of sustainability explored through the programme supports all four themes outlined in the strategy, most themes 1 and 2.

Student Leadership Award

Winner: Briagh

Briagh has taken the initiative to lead a personal sustainability project focused on exploring the environmental benefits of lavender and its packaging. Although Briagh worked independently, their commitment to sustainability has driven meaningful change both in their immediate community and beyond.

Community Action Award

Winner: SU Photo Competition

The SU led an innovative community engagement campaign through the Campus Wilds Wildlife Photo Competition, designed to connect students with nature, creativity, and one another during a high-stress time in the academic calendar. Aware of the pressures around assessment deadlines and the Easter break, they aimed to create a simple yet impactful way for students to engage with their surroundings and prioritise their wellbeing.

Environmental Improvement Award

Winner: Lakeside Nature Trail

One of the key features is the education of all ages on the uses of Lakeside, along with raising awareness about wildlife, ecosystems, and biodiversity in the area. We hope that this will help increase public understanding of environmental sustainability and highlight the importance of conserving and maintaining the natural environment both locally and internationally. We also focus on supporting local biodiversity through small-scale conservation efforts. One such initiative involves the imminent creation of large and small scale bug hotels and hibernaculum along the wooded area of the trail.

Innovation for Engagement

Winner: Lavender Bags Team

For the next academic year in accommodation, this project can encourage sustainability by promoting natural, low-waste alternatives to synthetic air fresheners and pest repellents. Lavender offers calming, aromatic, and practical benefits, and using it in simple sachets makes it easy for students to adopt eco-friendly habits in their personal spaces. By introducing this project, students can be inspired to reuse materials, explore plant-based solutions, and reduce reliance on chemical sprays or single-use products. It also opens up opportunities for DIY and community engagement through shared crafting or growing initiatives.

Sustainability Hero

Winner: Rebecca Ball

A passionate and dedicated Environmental Management and Sustainability student whose involvement in the Bird Friendly Campus project has made a lasting impact on both the team and the wider university community. As an Environmental Management and Sustainability student, I have connected my academic studies with my practical involvement in sustainability efforts on campus. From the outset of the Bird Friendly Campus project, Rebecca eagerly jumped in—helping staff conduct campus bird surveys and learning to identify local species. My growing expertise has not only supported the collection of meaningful data but has also inspired other students to engage in campus biodiversity efforts.
